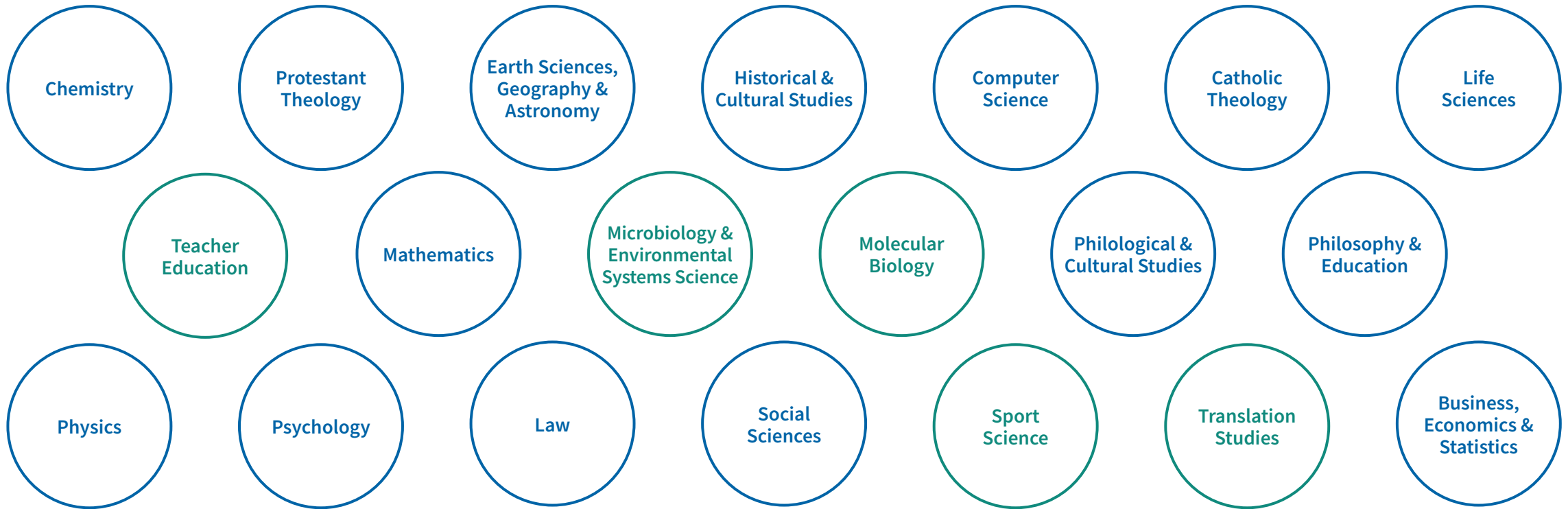

- Founded by Duke Rudolph IV in 1365 as the **Alma Mater Rudolphina Vindobonensis**
- One of the oldest and largest universities in Europe
- Opening of the historic Main Building of the University in the heart of Vienna's city centre in 1884
- More than 60 locations in Vienna
- Host of more than 1,000 events and 350 international conferences

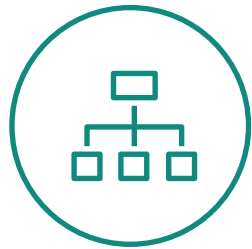

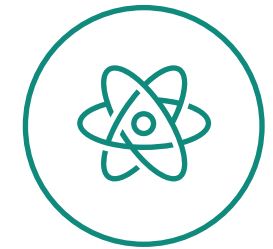

ERC grants and Nobel Prize: Leading-edge research

118 ERC grants have already been awarded to researchers from the University of Vienna since 2007.

To receive funding from the European Research Council (ERC), research projects must have a high potential for innovation.

The University of Vienna is pleased that Anton Zeilinger has been awarded the Nobel Prize 2022 in Physics.



Degree programmes: individual specialisation through a wide range of degree programmes

- There are 1.9 million people living in Vienna, more than 10 % of whom are students from 120 different nations. About 85,000 students are enrolled at the University of Vienna.
- The University of Vienna offers 186 degree programmes (bachelor's, master's, diploma programmes and doctoral programmes).
- Together with cooperating university colleges of teacher education, the University of Vienna is also the largest teacher education institution in Austria. It offers 29 teaching subjects/specialisations.

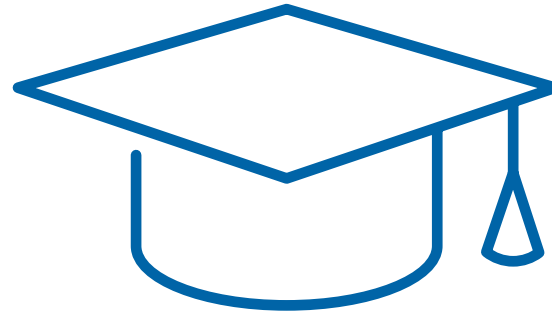

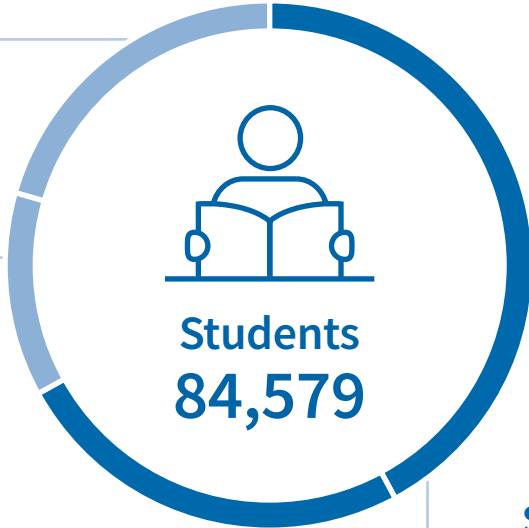

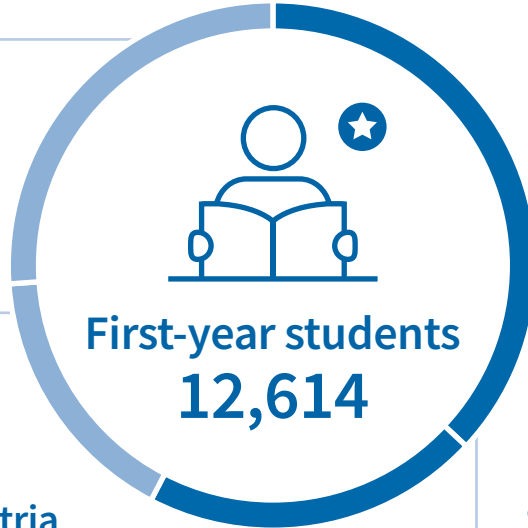

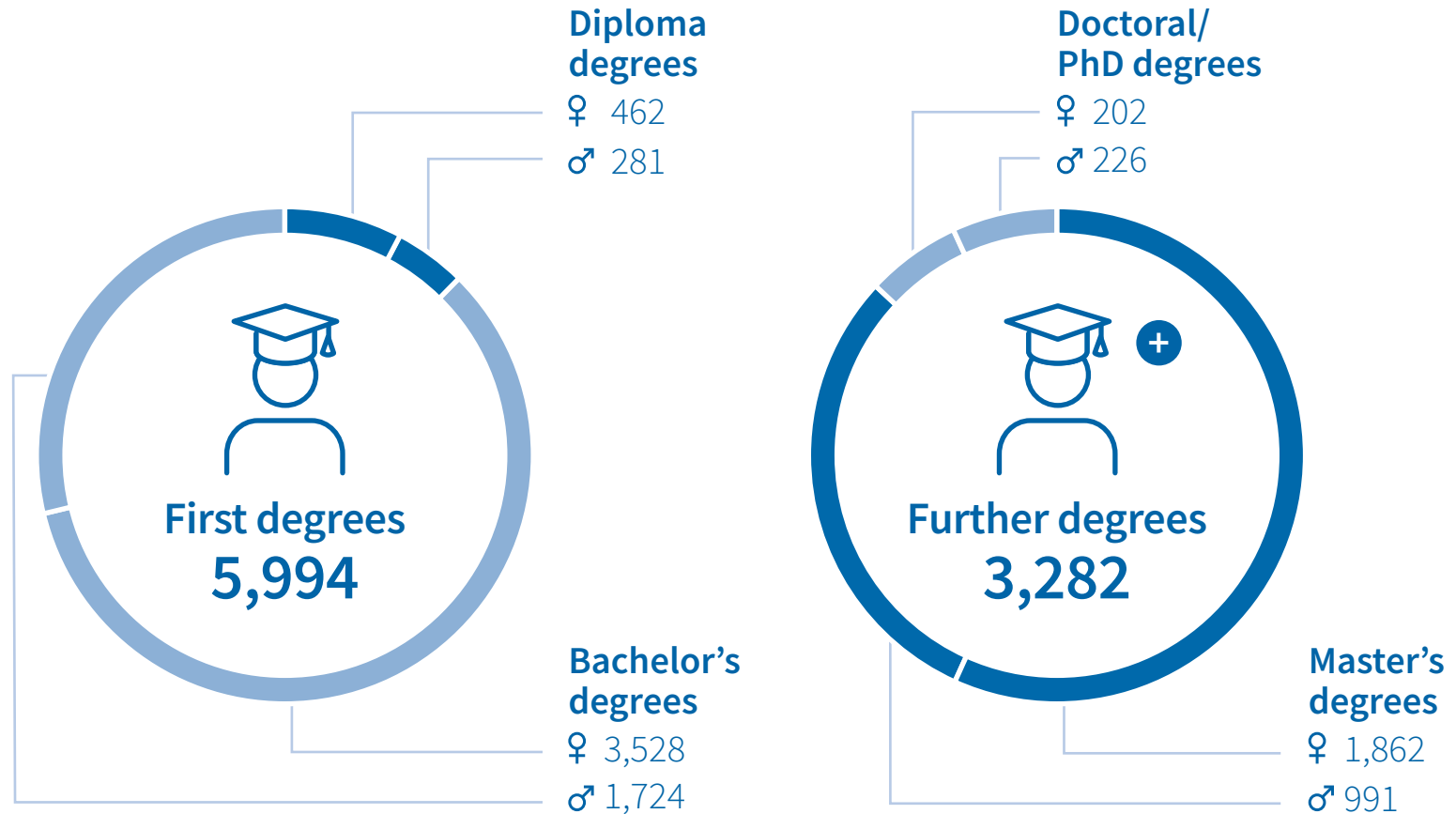

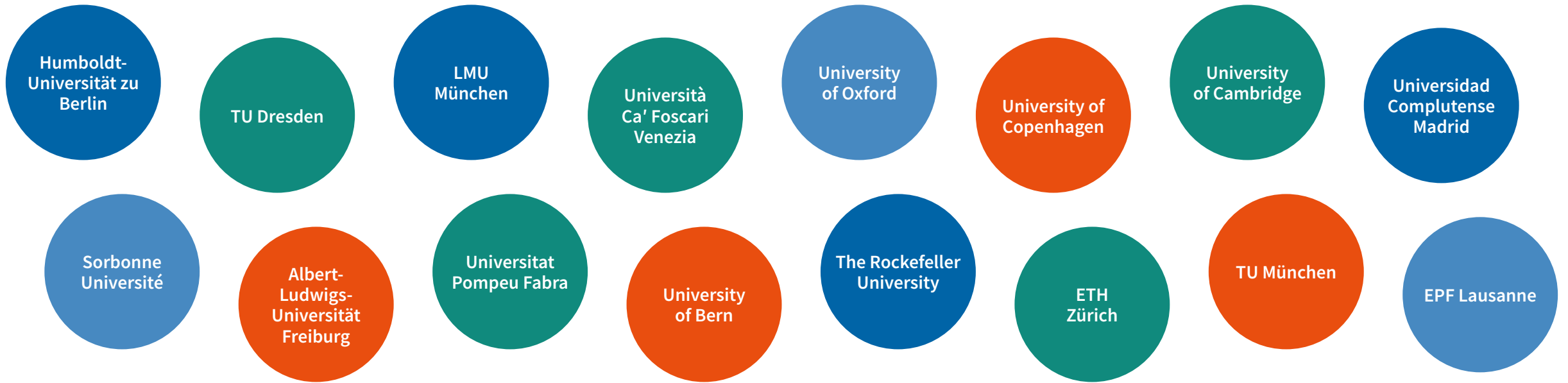

New professorial appointments

- More than 70 new professorships were advertised at the end of 2018
- Since then, additional professorships have been advertised continuously
- Qualitative and quantitative investment, biggest expansion of the University of Vienna since its advance in the second half of the 19th century
- Mainly international appointments in **fields of future strategic importance**

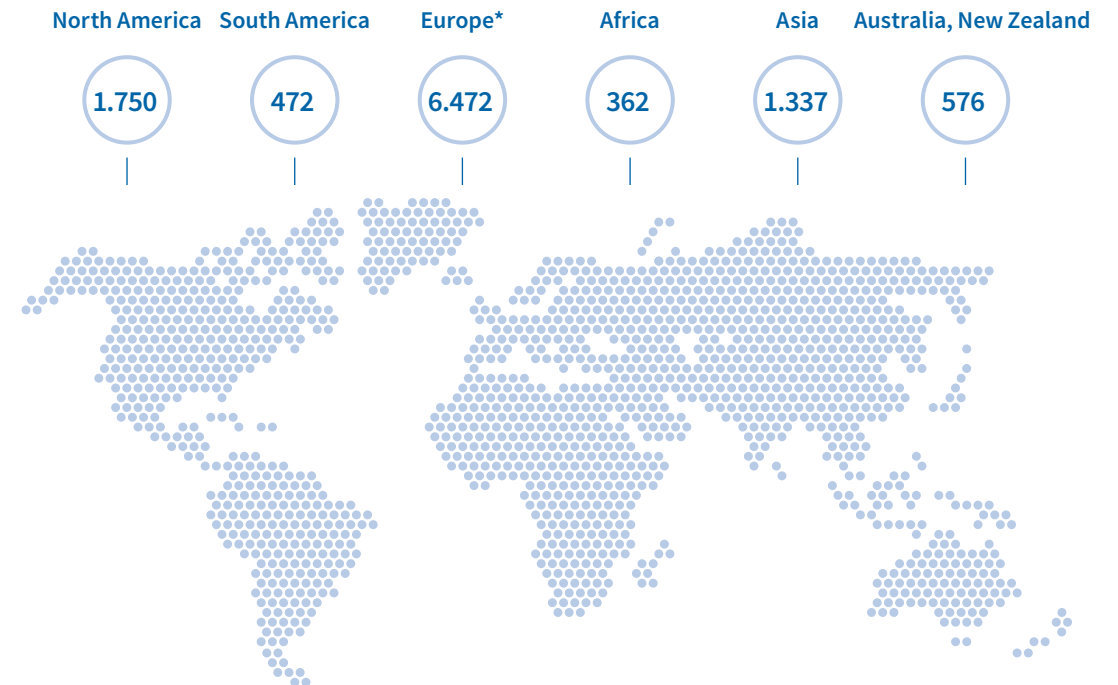
- University-wide partnership agreements: about 90

International publication collaborations 2020–2022



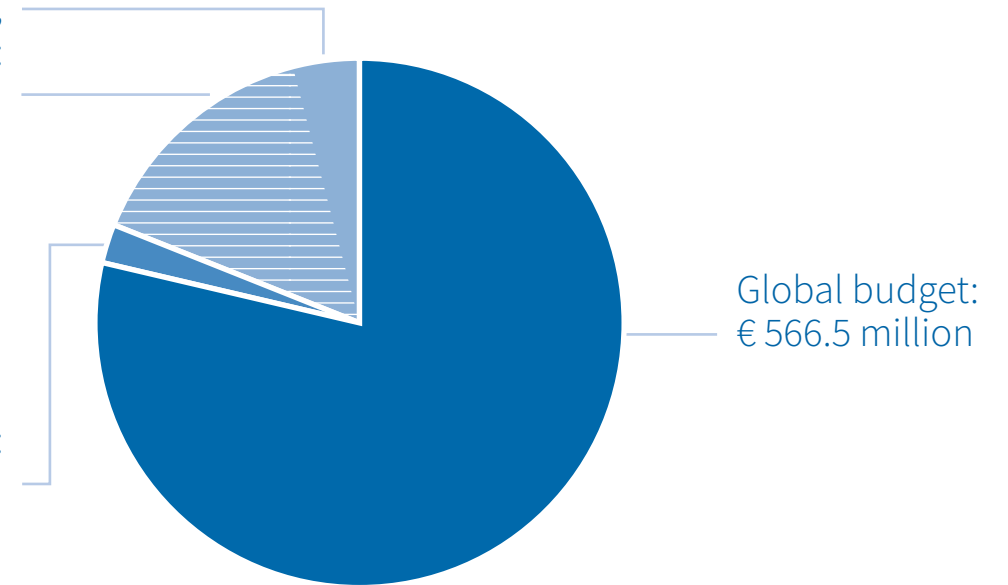

University revenues 1 January 2022–31 December 2022

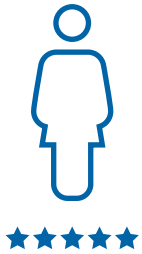

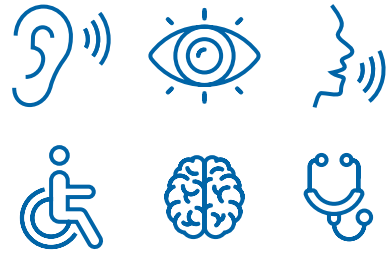

The **Accessible Studying team** advises prospective students, students and professors on studying with impairments.



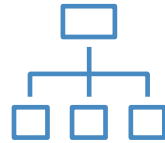
The University of Vienna is committed to the use of **gender-inclusive language** and has issued guidelines on this particular topic.

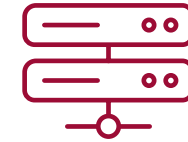
